Administrative Resource - Long-Term Substitute Teachers

The following procedures will be utilized to calculate compensation for long-term substitute teachers. These procedures are consistent with Article 25, Section 7 of the Teachers' Agreement.

- 1. A substitute teacher who replaces the <u>same</u> regular teacher for more than 20 continuous school days will be paid retroactively at the per diem of 1/180th of the first step of the appropriate lane of the teachers' salary schedule.
- 2. Once a substitute teacher has achieved this 20 continuous day status, a break in service, either voluntary or for illness, also breaks this continuous service cycle.
- 3. Upon a return to service following a break resulting from voluntary choice or illness, the substitute teacher must again establish a 20 day continuous status in order to receive the benefit described in #1 and in Article 25, Section 7 of the Teachers' Agreement.
- 4. A substitute teacher who has accumulated more than 20 continuous days of service but not all with the same teacher, <u>will not</u> be eligible for the benefit described in #1 and in the Teachers' Agreement Article 25, Section 7.
- 5. Individual substitute days are paid at a rate of \$95 per diem.
